Weekly Phonics:

- Your child is currently accessing **Phase 5**.
- Use www.phonicsplay.co.uk to access activities from Phase 2 to Phase 5 (Username: march20 Password: home).
- This week practise alternative spellings for the 'ai' sound. Look for Mr. Thorne on www.youtube.com for a reminder. Search – ai, ae, ay, ei, eigh, e – Phonics Alternative Spellings
- Use a highlighter to mark all the words with an 'ai' sound in the story of 'The School Sale' below. How many different spellings can you find?

- Use www.spellingshed.com to practise spellings. I'll be checking your new spellings on Friday and there are 50 extra honeypots on offer for every day you have practised!

Writing: Jack and the Beanstalk

- This week I would like you to write your own version of Jack and the Beanstalk. (Just part of the story.)
- First of all, you will need to create a plan. Let's make this as fun as possible! Use whatever resources you have at home to create a representation of the story. This could be lego, small world toys, a drawing, junk modelling etc... (I've including lots of ideas at the bottom of the page.)
- Once you have your representation of the story, I would like you to change the character of the giant. You can change this to anything you like, a teddy, an old lady, a robot, a dragon etc...
- Now do a drawing of your new character, label it using lots of adjectives and write a few sentences about your character so that you really to get to know it.
- Now you are ready to write your new version of the story. Start your story at the point when Jack wakes up the morning after selling the cow. Please remember capital letters and full stops and try to join two ideas using the word 'and'.

Reading:

- Use My Rising Stars website, log in to read your allocated books and attempt the activities/quizzes at the end. (These will be changed weekly)
- Have a look in your book collection. Do you have any stories that are similar to Jack and the Beanstalk? This could be traditional tales, stories about giants, stories with magical characters or objects etc...

Number Skills:

- Use the login provided to access www.mathsnoproblem.com
This week Year 1 could explore the lessons in Chapter 18 (Textbook and workbook 1B) – Volume and Capacity. Just have fun with this! Use a paddling pool, the kitchen sink or bath time to explore the capacity of different containers. How many cups of water does it take to fill a larger container? Can they guess? Encourage children to use the vocabulary full, half- full, fuller, less full, a quarter full.

P.E.

- Encourage your child to think of lots of different physical activities to do outside e.g. run around the garden, catch a ball, bunny hop, go down the slide etc... How many times can they do the given activity in a minute? If they can walk around the edge of the garden 10 times in a minute, how many times do they think they can run around the edge of the garden in a minute?

Geography

- This week we are looking at weather. Start by watching www.youtube.com How are weather forecasts made? (Learning Zone).
- Create your own rain gauge to measure how much it rains this week or create your own weather sock so that you can see which way the wind is blowing. You can do this any way you want to, or you can go to [www.wikihow.com/Make-a](http://www.wikihow.com/Make-a-Windsock-for-children) Windsock-for-children for instructions on how to make a plastic windsock.

Science

- This week we are continuing to explore plant growth.
- Discuss the differences between seeds and bulbs and then have a look in the garden for any plants that grow from bulbs e.g. a dying daffodil. If you can, dig up a bulb and ask a grown-up to cut it in half for you. Look closely and then have a go at drawing the bulb. Have a go at labelling the parts of the bulb – there are lots of pictures on google images that will help you.

R.E

- Revisit the Islamic creation story by watching the power point on twinkl. Download the story sequencing cards if you can and try to put them in the correct order.

D&T/Art

- Continue to explore spirals by creating your own patterned spiral snake. You could make this into a puppet.



ICT

- As your child logs into our online learning resources, continue to talk to them about the importance of keeping all passwords safe.
