

DT Exemplification

Key Stage 2 Autumn Term Cycle C

During this unit the children the children were taught about a variety of different stitches both functional and decorative to create a drawstring bag or purse. They made and used a simple pattern to create their product and designed their own decorative stitching using Viking runes as inspiration.

The examples here show the progression throughout KS2.

First Level

This is joined with a back stitch which is functional and reasonably even.

The purse has some areas where the overall shape is lost due to uneven stitching. The split stitch is evident although there are some inaccuracies

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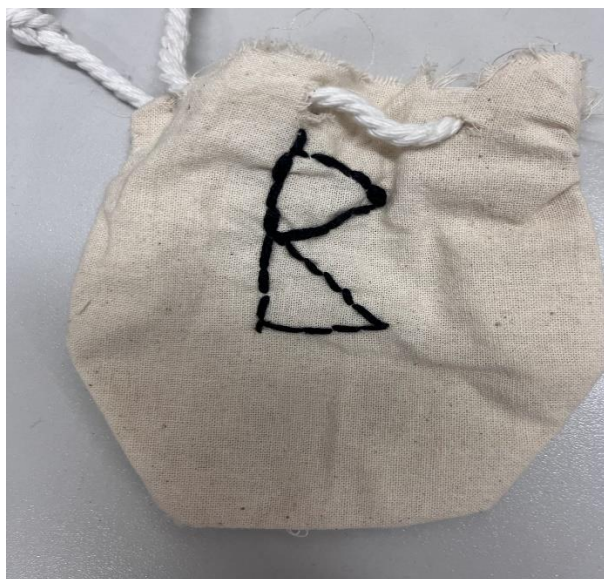


Second Level

The back stitch is even and functional.

The purse shape is regular as the back stitching is more even throughout

The decoration with split stitch is reasonably accurate



Third Level

The back stitch is even and functional.

The purse shape is regular as the back stitching is more even throughout

The decoration is much more detailed. The tie has an addition to the ends to prevent fraying.



Fourth Level

All back stitching is very neat and well spaced which has produced a neat and even shaped product.

Decorative design is more complex and shows good control of the split stitch.

There is a very clear distinction between the straight and curved lines on the decoration.
